[] **SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY:** Up to fifty (50) words describing the speaker's clinical and/or research pursuits and relevance to lecture topic. If multiple lecturers giving a single presentation, limit each speaker biography to 35 words for each. Include primary speaker contact information.

[] **SPEAKER CV/RESUME**

[] **SPEAKER PHOTOGRAPH:** An image file (color headshot) at minimum resolution of 300 dpi (dots per inch) in JPG or TIF file format.

[] **ABSTRACTS CRITERIA:**

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Content shall be pertinent to topic of lecture.
- Focused on clinical interventions.
- Applicable to the specialty of Anti-Aging Medicine.
- Content shall be absent of commercial statements and/or product endorsement. When mention of a particular product is necessary, opt to generic whenever possible.
- Include a minimum of four (4) References (bibliographic citations) and, if appropriate, Resources (relevant sources of additional information on the subject of your article).
- Timeliness to current event in disease and society.
- Limit your submission to a maximum of two (2) pages.
- Submit in MS® Word file format.
- Illustrations: submit electronic files as TIF, EPS, JPG, or GIF. Color illustrations are preferable.
- For style, conform to *AMA Manual of Style, 9th Edition* editorial guidelines.
